This document provides instructions for installing and using the Graffiti theme. Since the instructions are specific to the theme, they do not cover every WordPress function. For help with using WordPress, please see the **Further Reading** boxes (like the one at the bottom of this page). We also recommend the tutorials at codex.wordpress.org.

Before installing the theme, please make sure you are using **WordPress 3.0**. If you have an older version of WordPress, the option to upgrade will appear on the dashboard, or you can visit wordpress.org/download to get the latest version. For WordPress host requirements, please visit wordpress.org/about/requirements/.

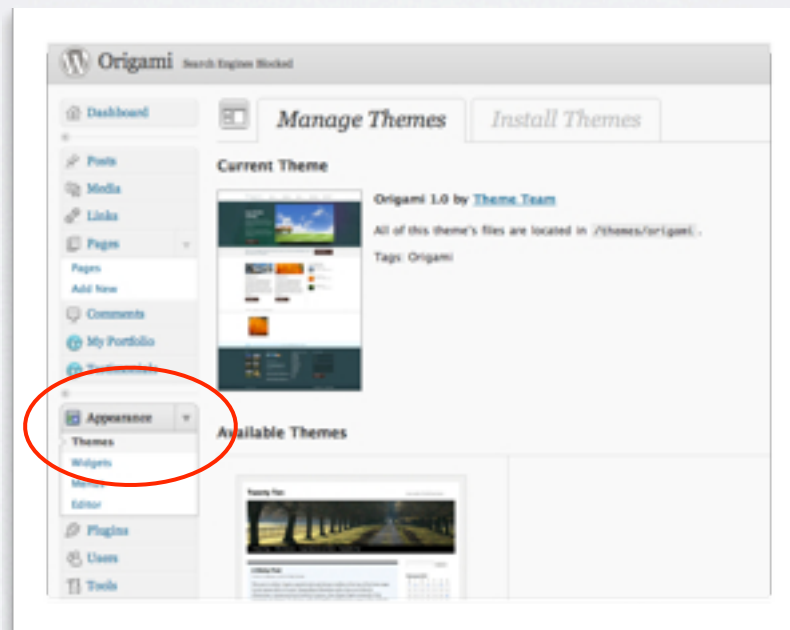
Installation

Activating the Theme

After you have downloaded Graffiti, you will need to activate the theme in WordPress.

To activate the theme:

1. Use an FTP client to access your host server and copy the downloaded **Graffiti** folder to **wp-content/themes**.
2. Log in to the WordPress Dashboard and go to **Appearance > Themes**.
3. Under **Available Themes**, find **Graffiti**. Click the **Activate** link.
4. The Graffiti theme is now activated and should appear under **Current Theme**:



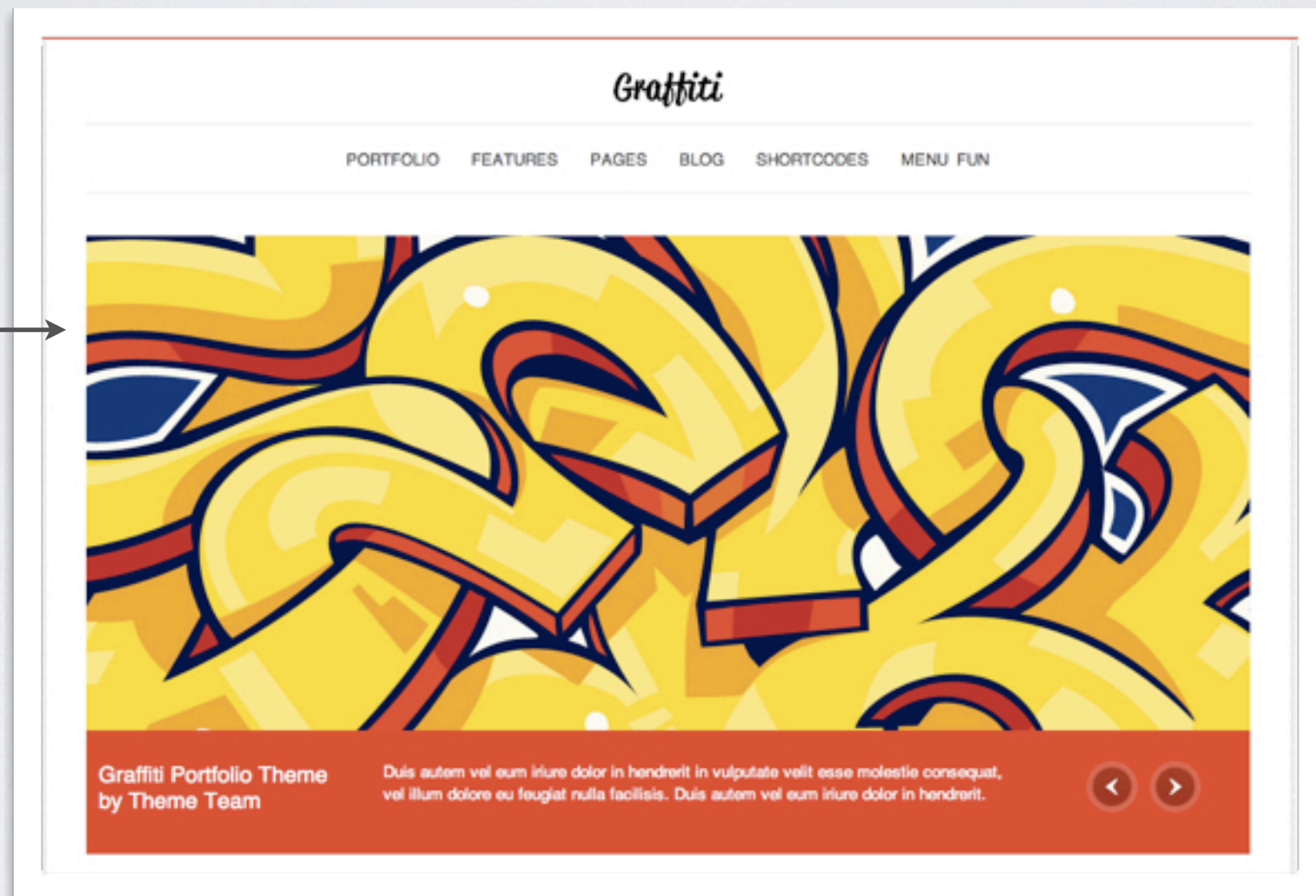

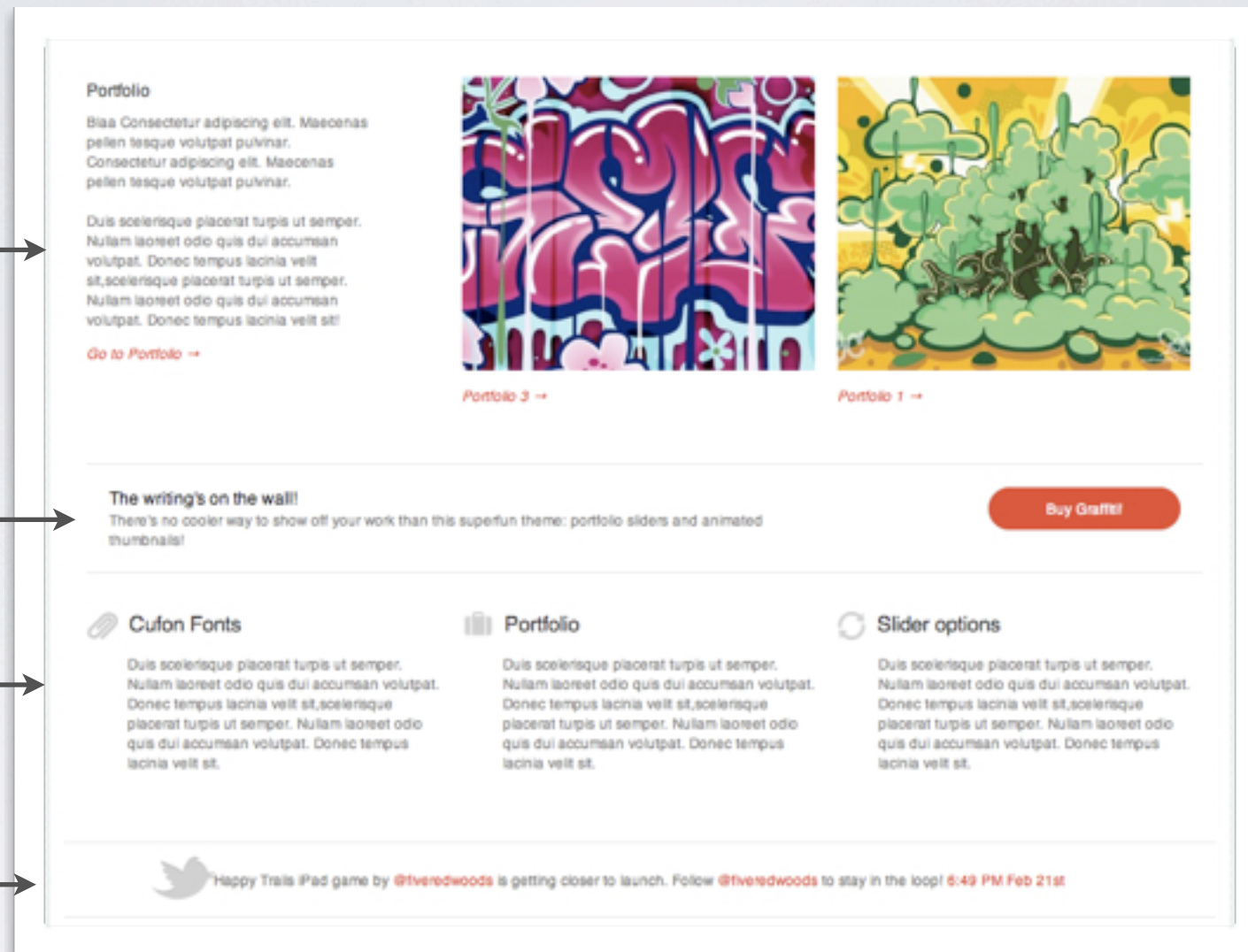

The Homepage Slider

The slider displays images, slide titles and descriptions. Images must have a height of 400 pixels and should be 900 pixels wide. The slideshow runs automatically and also has a controller.

- Portfolio Listing
- 3 Sticky Posts
- None (hides this area)

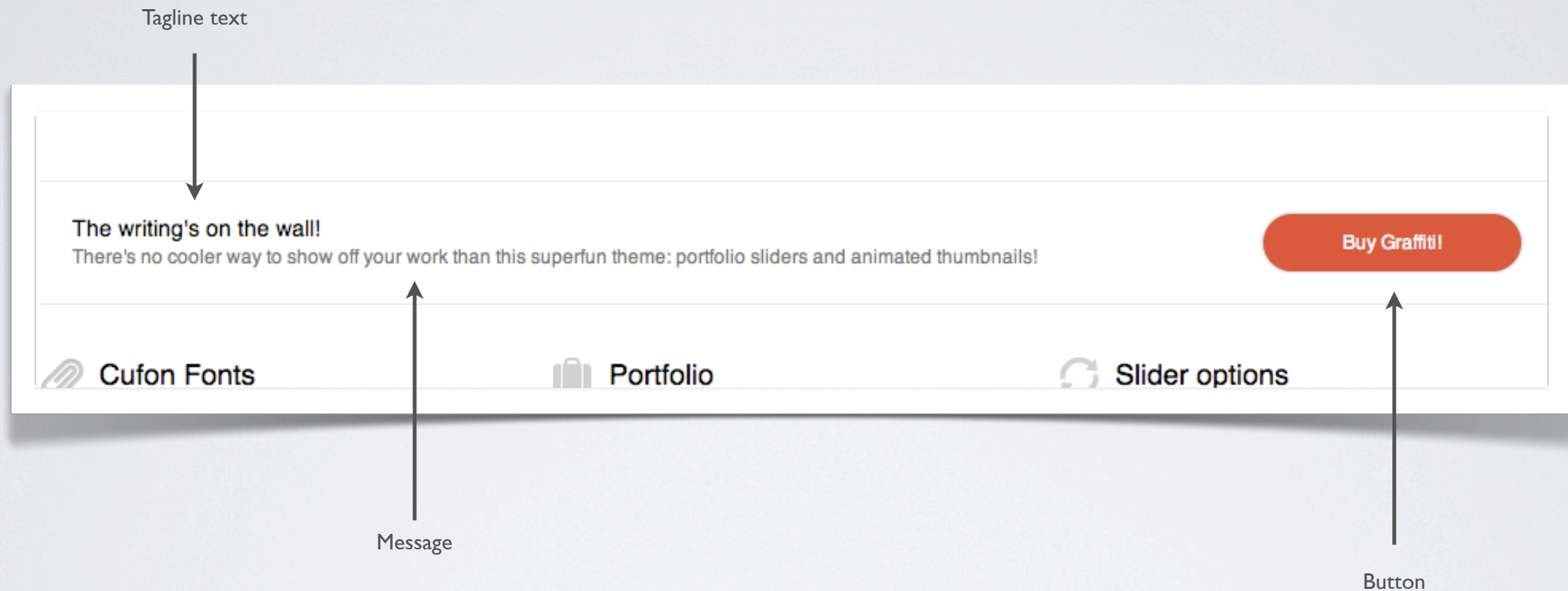

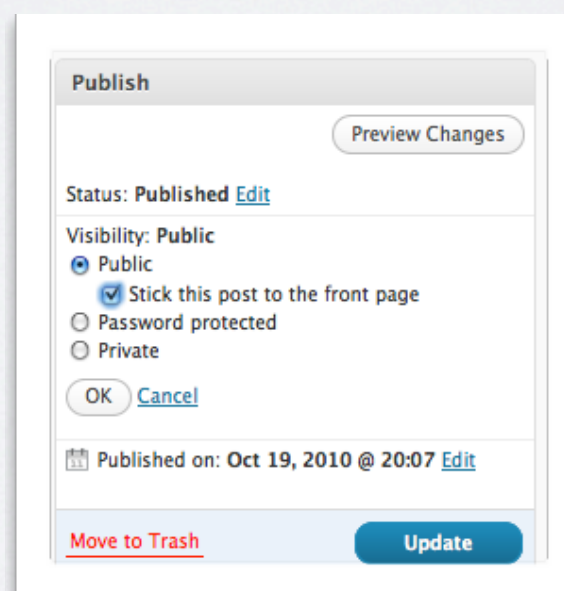

Featured Posts: Sticky Posts

Sticky Posts are posts that appear in the Featured Posts area of the homepage indefinitely (until you remove them or choose new ones).

To add sticky posts to the homepage:

1. Under the navigation menu, go to **Posts** and select the post for which you would like to create a sticky.
2. On the right side of the work area, find the **Publish** box. Click the **Edit** link after **Visibility:**.
3. Select the checkbox **Stick this post to the front page**. Click the **OK** button.
4. Click the **Update** button. Make sure **Status:** is set to **Published** and **Visibility:** is set to **Public, Sticky**.

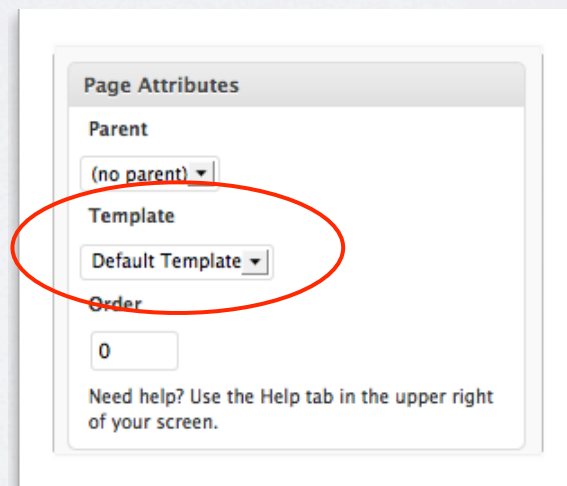


Page Templates

Applying a Page Template

You may choose from seven page templates to apply to pages you create. To apply a template:

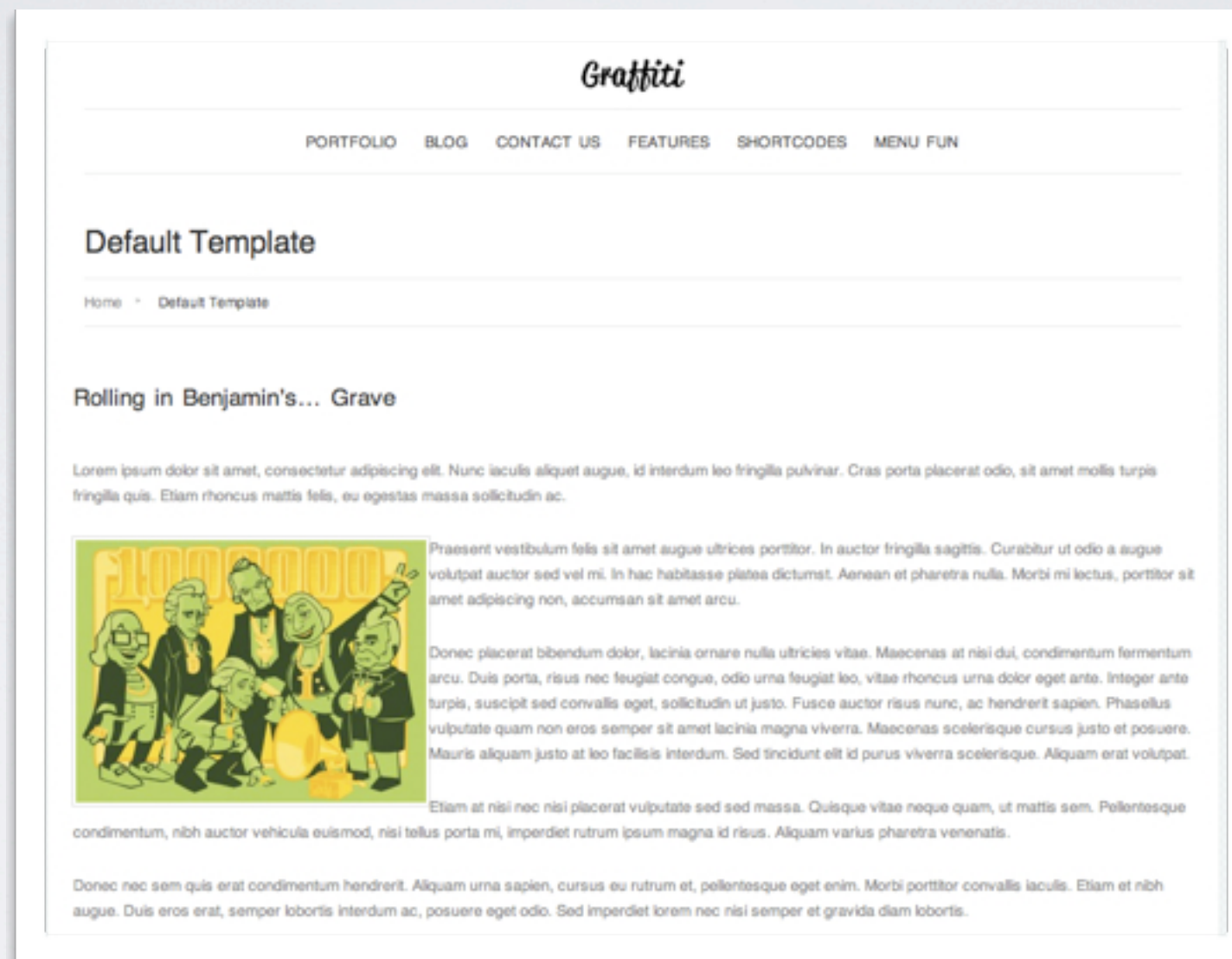
1. Under the main navigation menu, go to **Pages**. If you are adding a new page, go to **Add New**. If you are applying the template to an existing page, choose the page from the list of published pages.
2. If you are adding a new page, enter a title.
3. On the right side of the work area is a **Page Attributes** box. Select a template in the **Template** drop-down menu. Click the **Update** button to save the settings.

Default Template

Default Template is a standard WordPress page layout with one column. The column allows any type of content.

Default with Sidebar

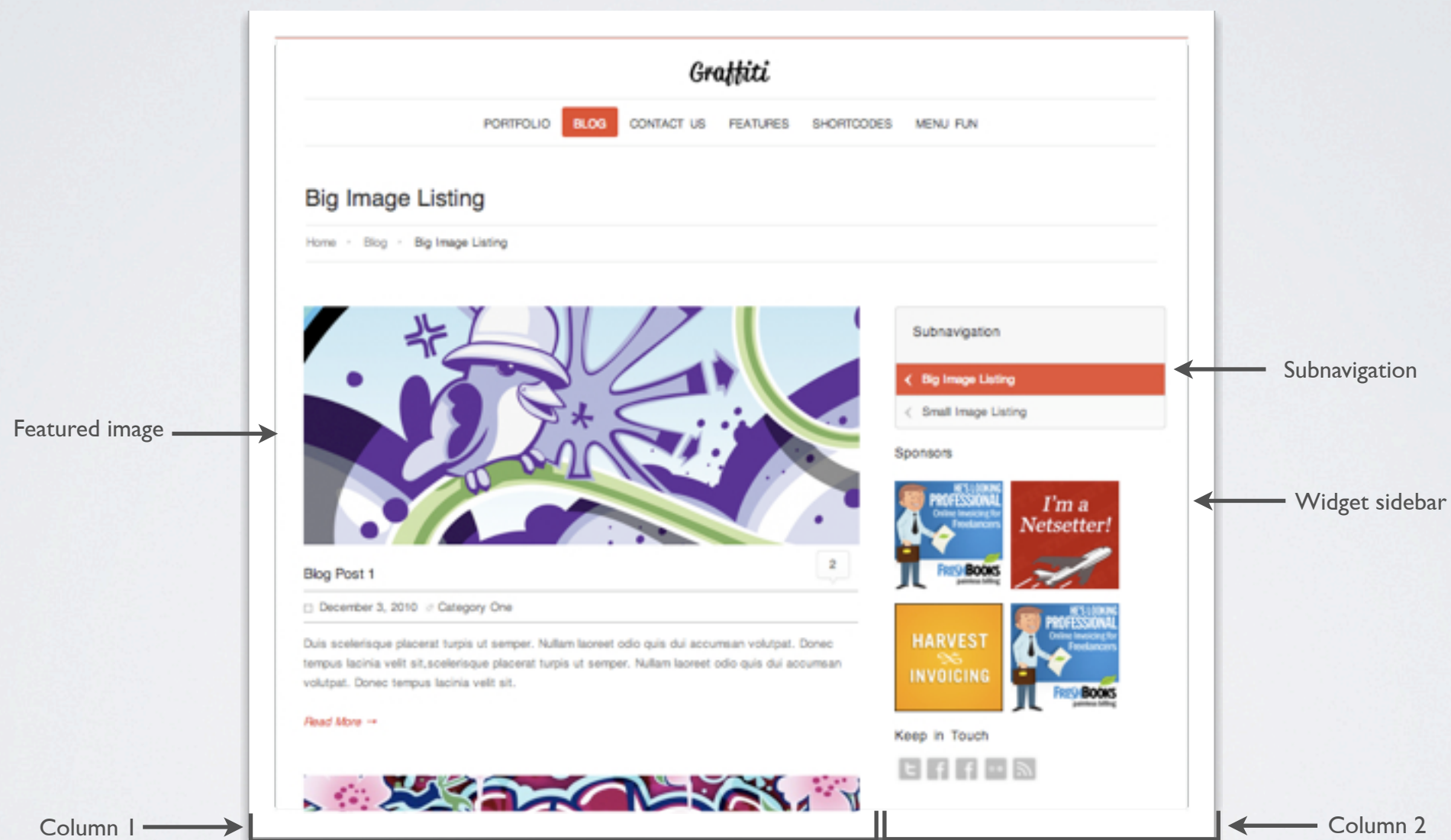
Default with Sidebar is a standard WordPress page layout with two columns. The left column allows any type of content and right column is a widget sidebar.

Big Image Listing

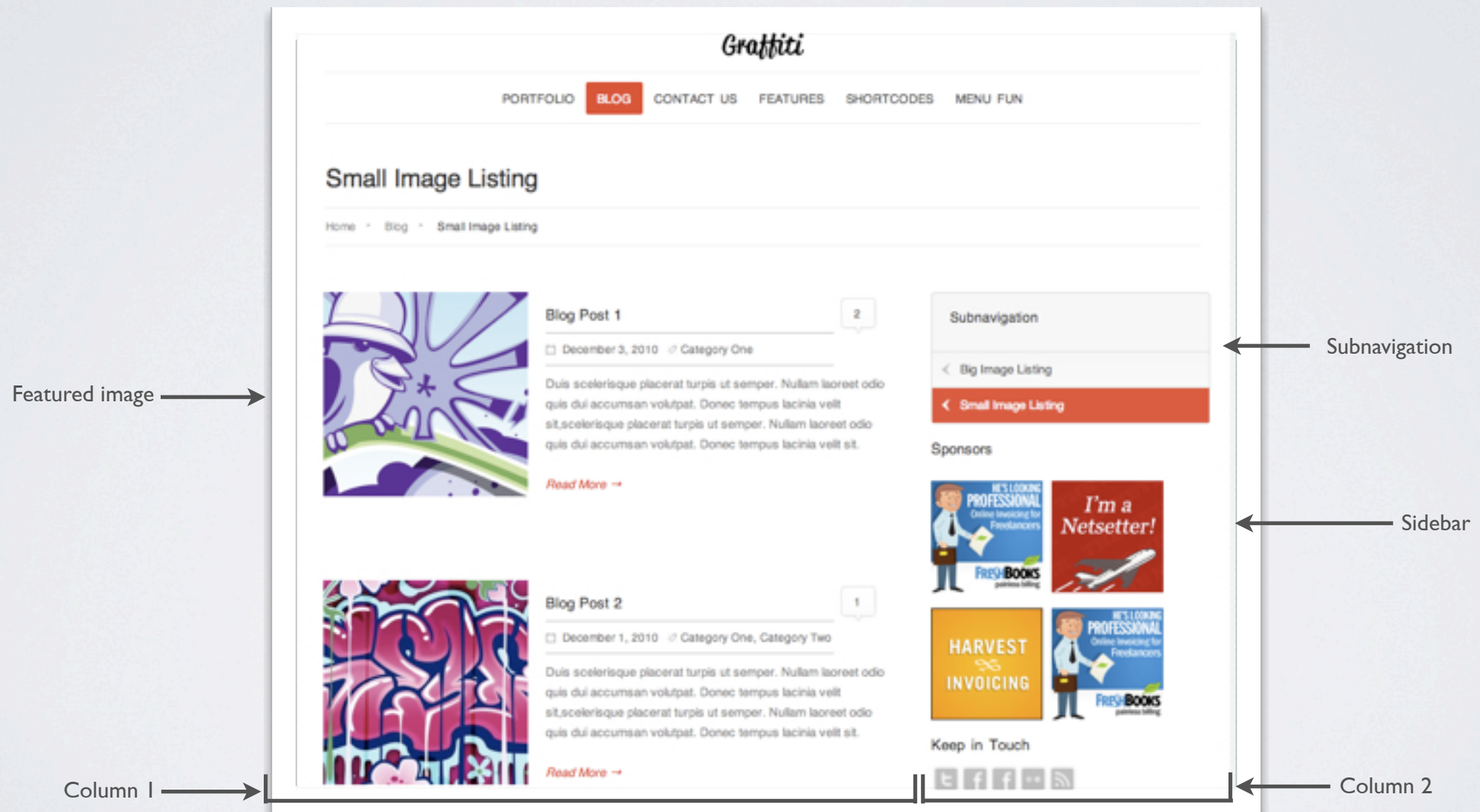
Big Image Listing is a blog listing layout with two columns. The left column lists recent blog posts and their large featured images. The right column is a widget sidebar.

Small Image Listing is a blog listing layout with two columns. The left column lists recent blog posts and their small featured images. The right column is a widget sidebar.



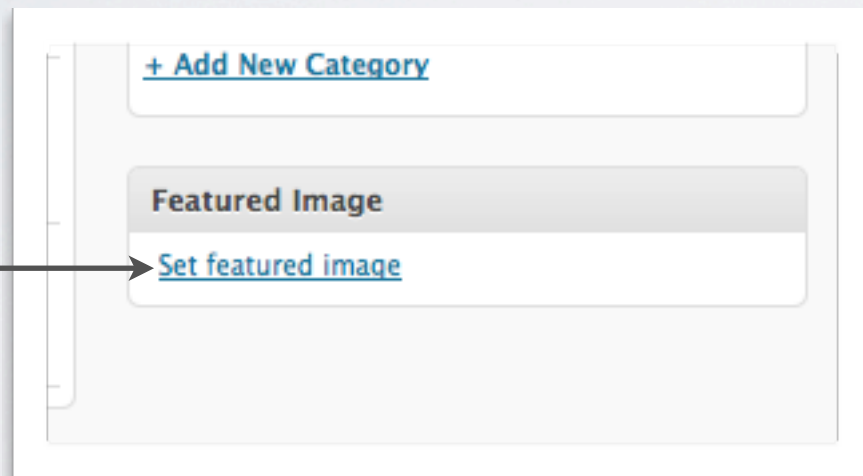

Setting Featured Images

To add a featured image to a post:

1. In the Dashboard, select **Posts** and select the post to which you would like to add an image.
2. On the right side of the work area, find the **Featured Image** box. Click the **Set featured image** link.
3. Select an image from the **Set featured image** box and close the box when you are done.

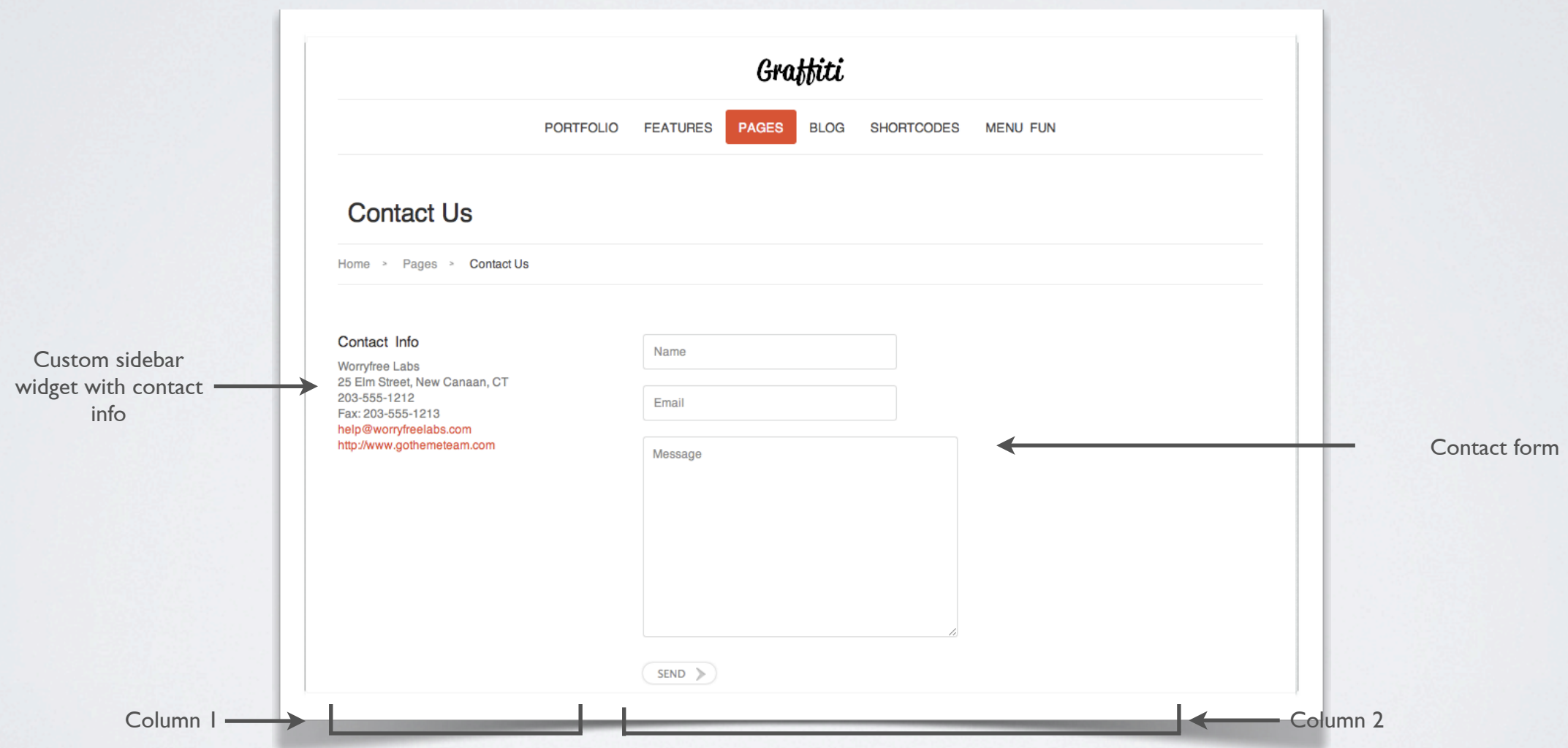

Contact Us

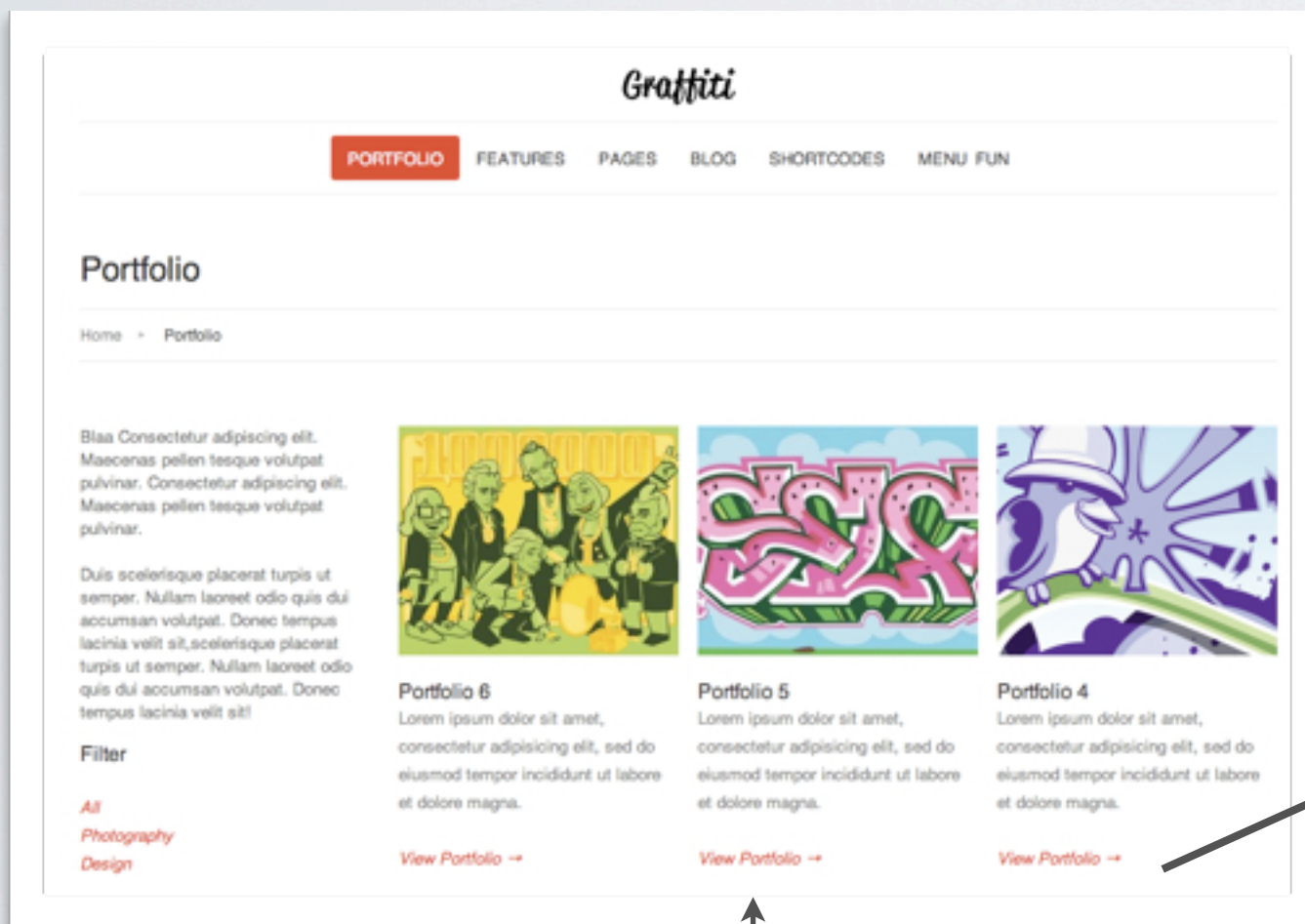
Contact Us template is a contact page layout with two columns. Portfolio

The Portfolio Listing Page templates showcase and organize your work. portfolio listing pages may have two, three or four columns. Images on these pages open in a lightbox when the user clicks them. To add portfolio items to portfolio listing pages, use Graffiti's **My Portfolio** custom post panel, which is explained in the **Custom Post Options > My Portfolio** section.

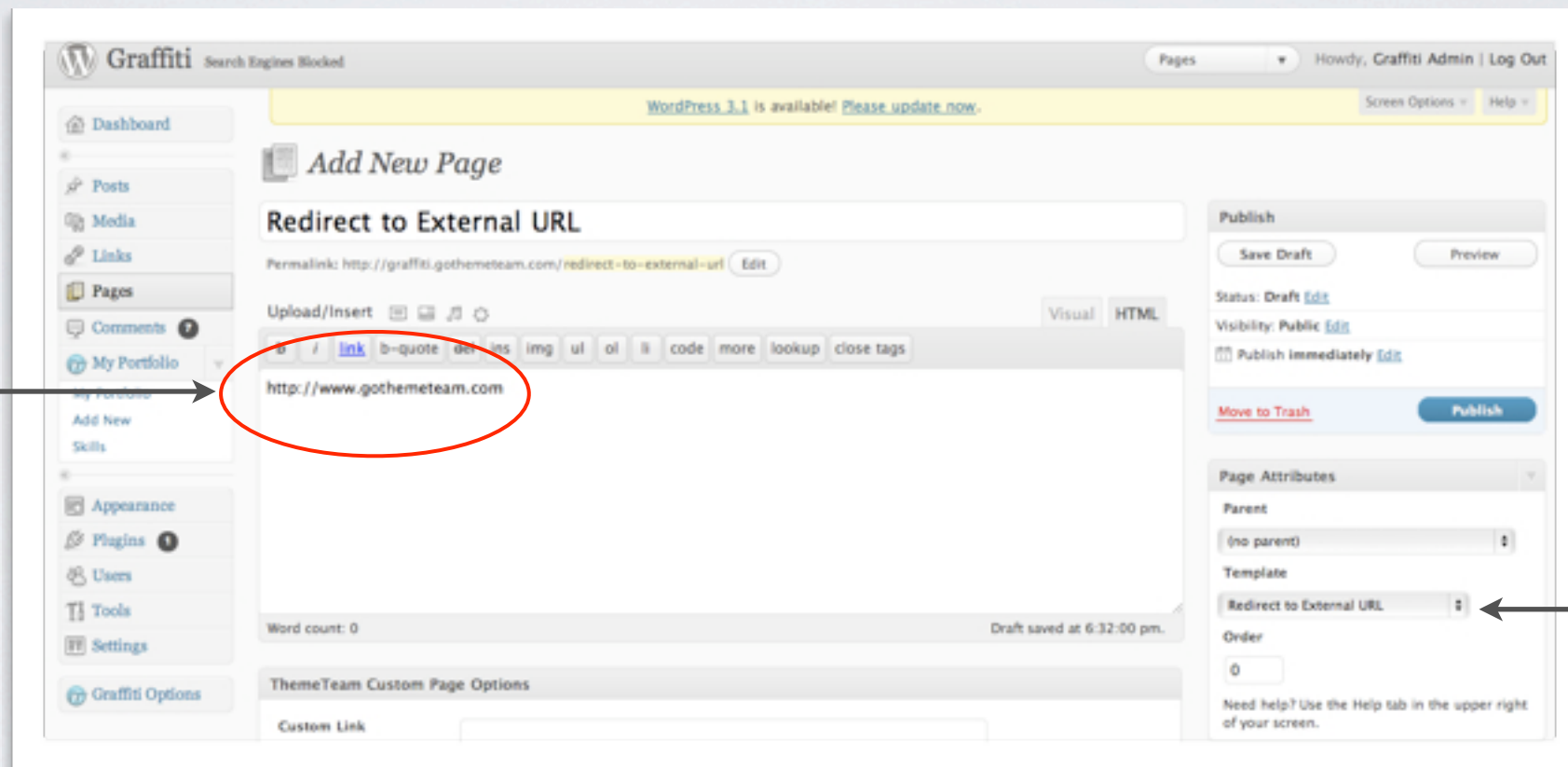

Page Templates

Redirect to External URL

The Redirect to External URL is a pseudo page template that redirects users to the URL entered in that page's HTML. When the page is assigned to a menu, clicking it will automatically take users to the specified website.

Creating Subpages

You may wish to organize your pages into a hierarchy. To create subpages (also known as child pages):

1. Click **Pages** in the Dashboard. If you are adding a new page, click **Add New**. If you would like to make an existing page a subpage, select the page from the list of published pages.
2. In the **Page Attributes** box, go to the **Parent** drop-down menu. Select the parent page under which you would like to place the current page.
4. Click the **Update** button. The page is now a child page of the selected parent page.



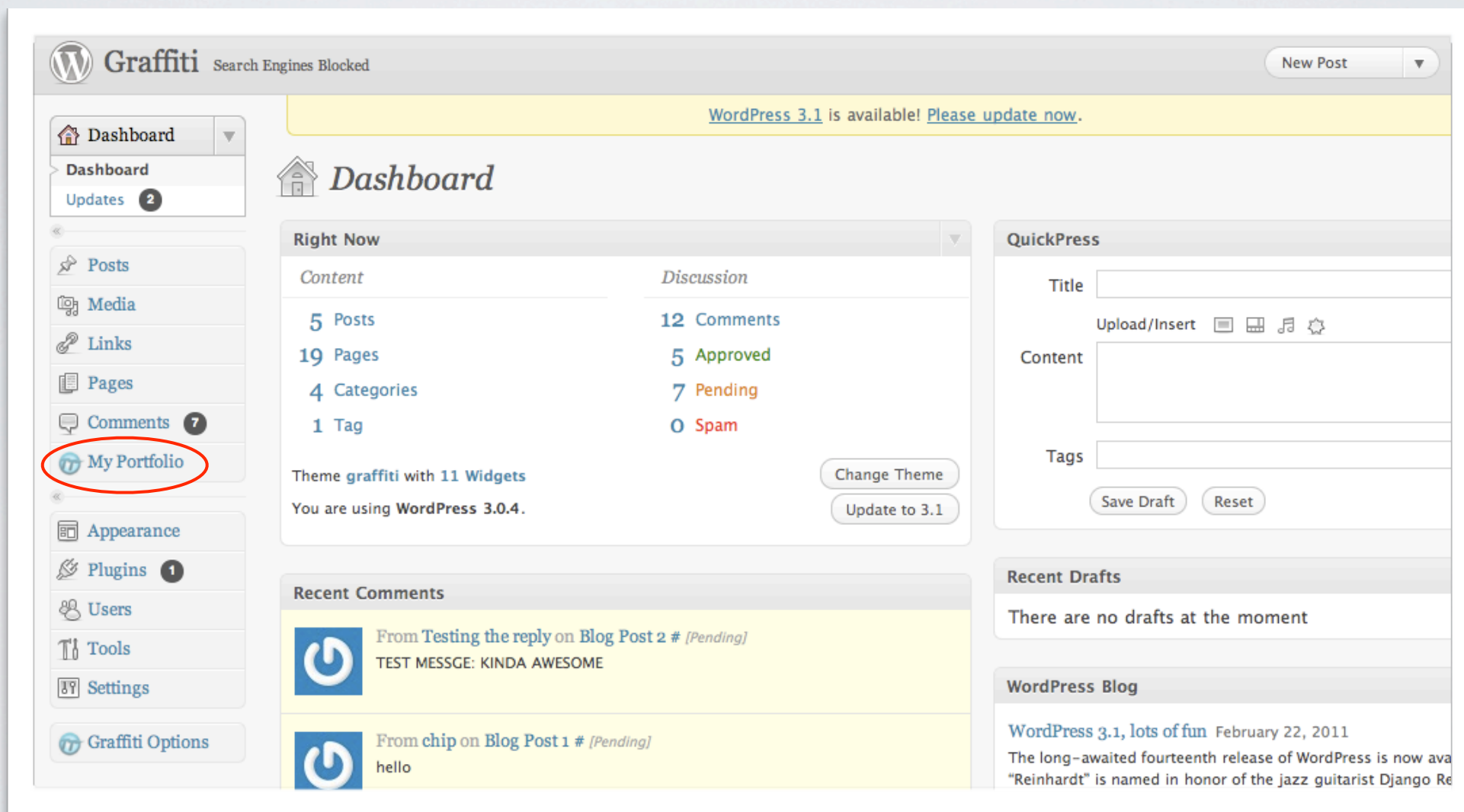

Custom Post Options

Overview

When the Graffiti theme is activated the **My Portfolio** custom pane appears in the Dashboard. Custom posts are just like regular WordPress posts, but they have special design and layout options.





My Portfolio

The **My Portfolio** panel allows you to add items that display on portfolio listing pages. To create a Portfolio Listing Page, apply one of the **Portfolio** templates to a new or existing page (see the **Page Templates** section for instructions on applying templates). Adding portfolio items is similar to adding posts.

To add a portfolio item:

1. Click **My Portfolio** in the Dashboard and select **Add New**.
2. Enter a title for the item in the top field and a text description in the content field:



3. To include a video with your portfolio item, scroll down to the box labeled **Theme Team Custom Portfolio Options** and enter its URL in the **Video URL** field:

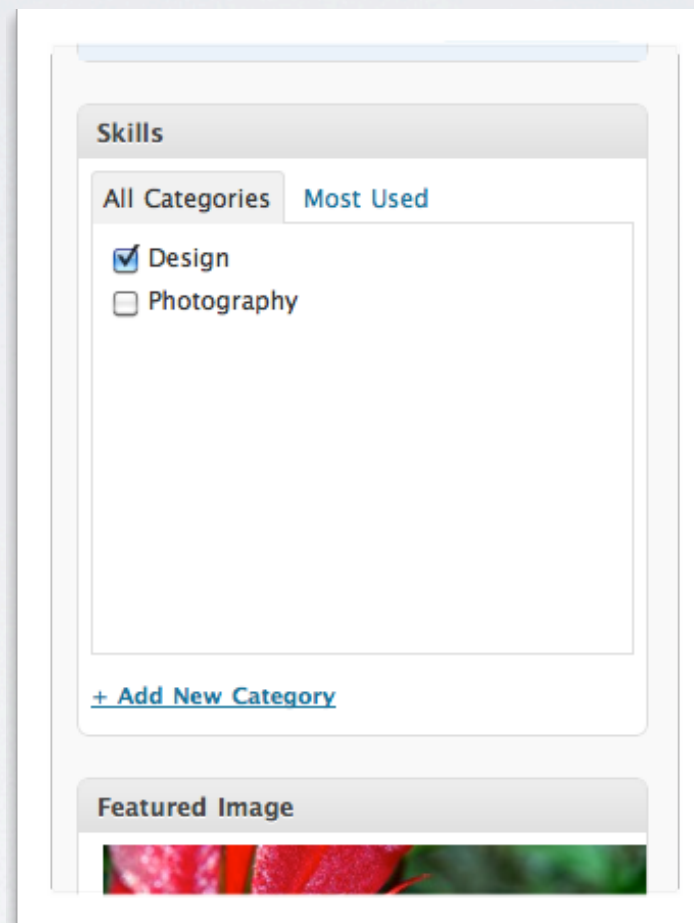

4. The **Skills** box on the right side of the Dashboards lists categories your portfolio item can appear under. Before you can list your portfolio item under a skill or skills, you must add skill categories.

5. Click the **Update** button before navigating from the portfolio item's page. In the WordPress navigation menu, click **Skills** under **My Portfolio**. Enter the category's details in each field and click the **Add New Category** button. **Note:** Skills and their slugs cannot contain spaces.

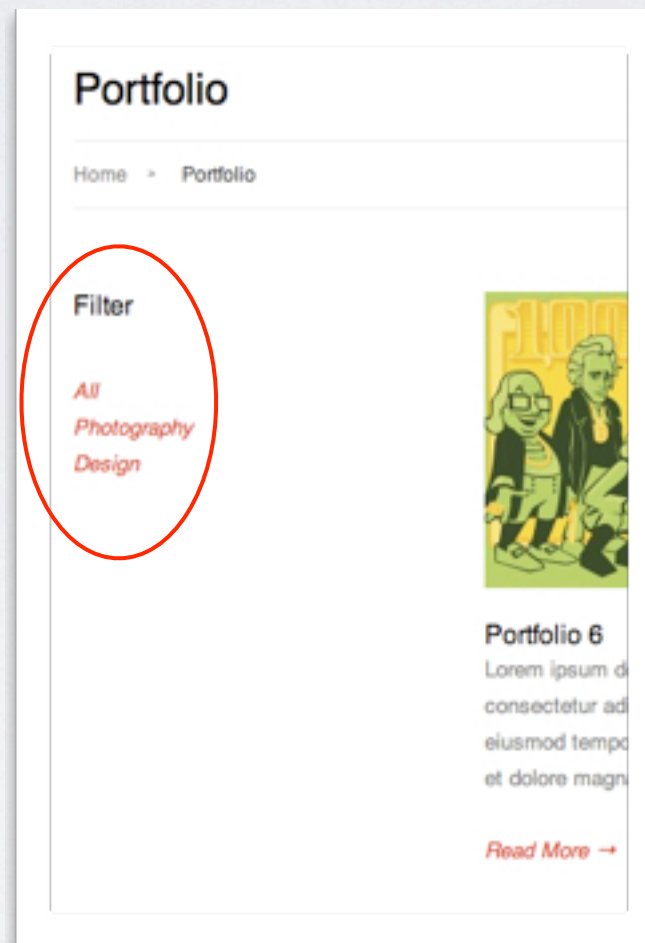

6. Now, return to the portfolio item and select the skill(s) you would like to list it under. You may add new categories with the **Add New Category** link under **Skills**. On the Portfolio page, categories will appear in the left column. These options filter your portfolio items—click one to display only portfolio items in that category.

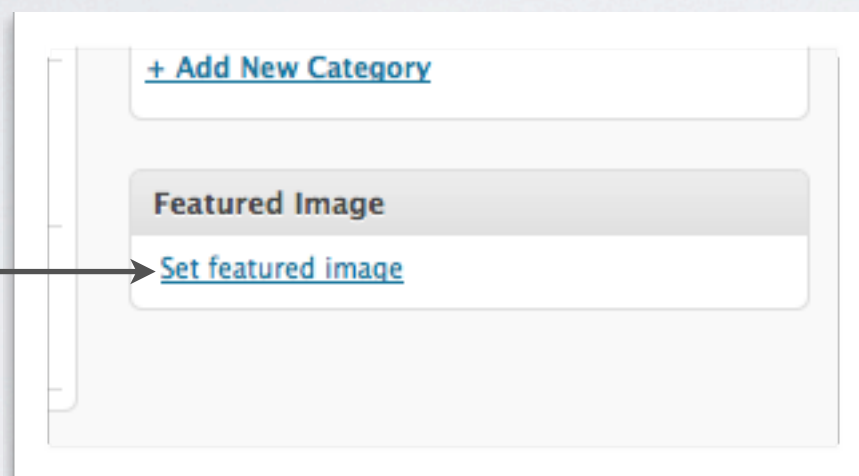

7. To add an image to the portfolio item, click the **Set featured image** link in the **Featured Image** box. Follow the instructions in the pop-up box to select a file.

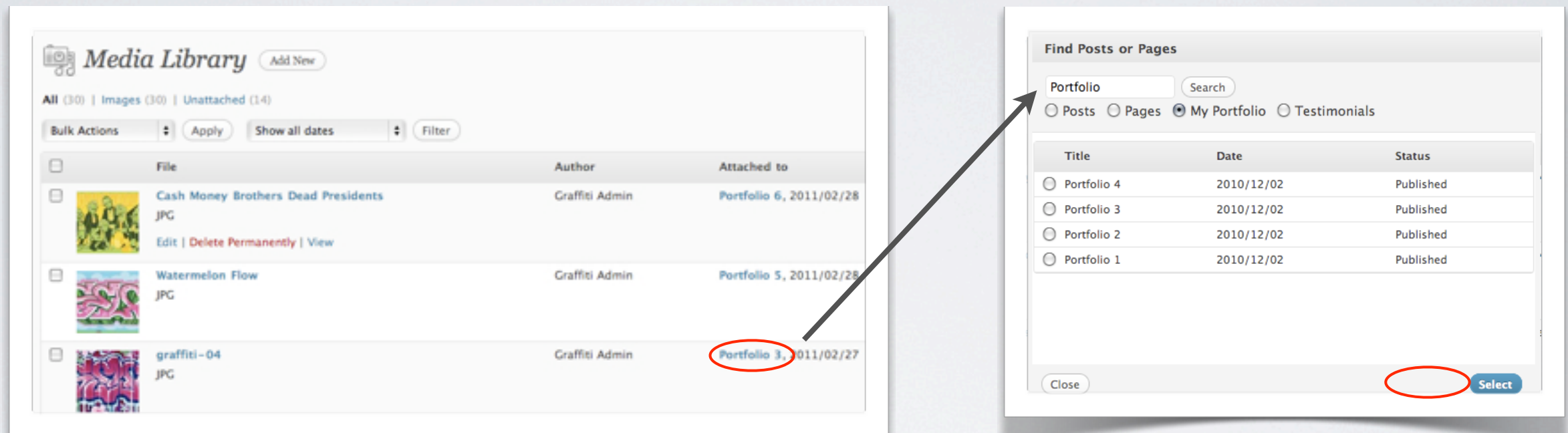

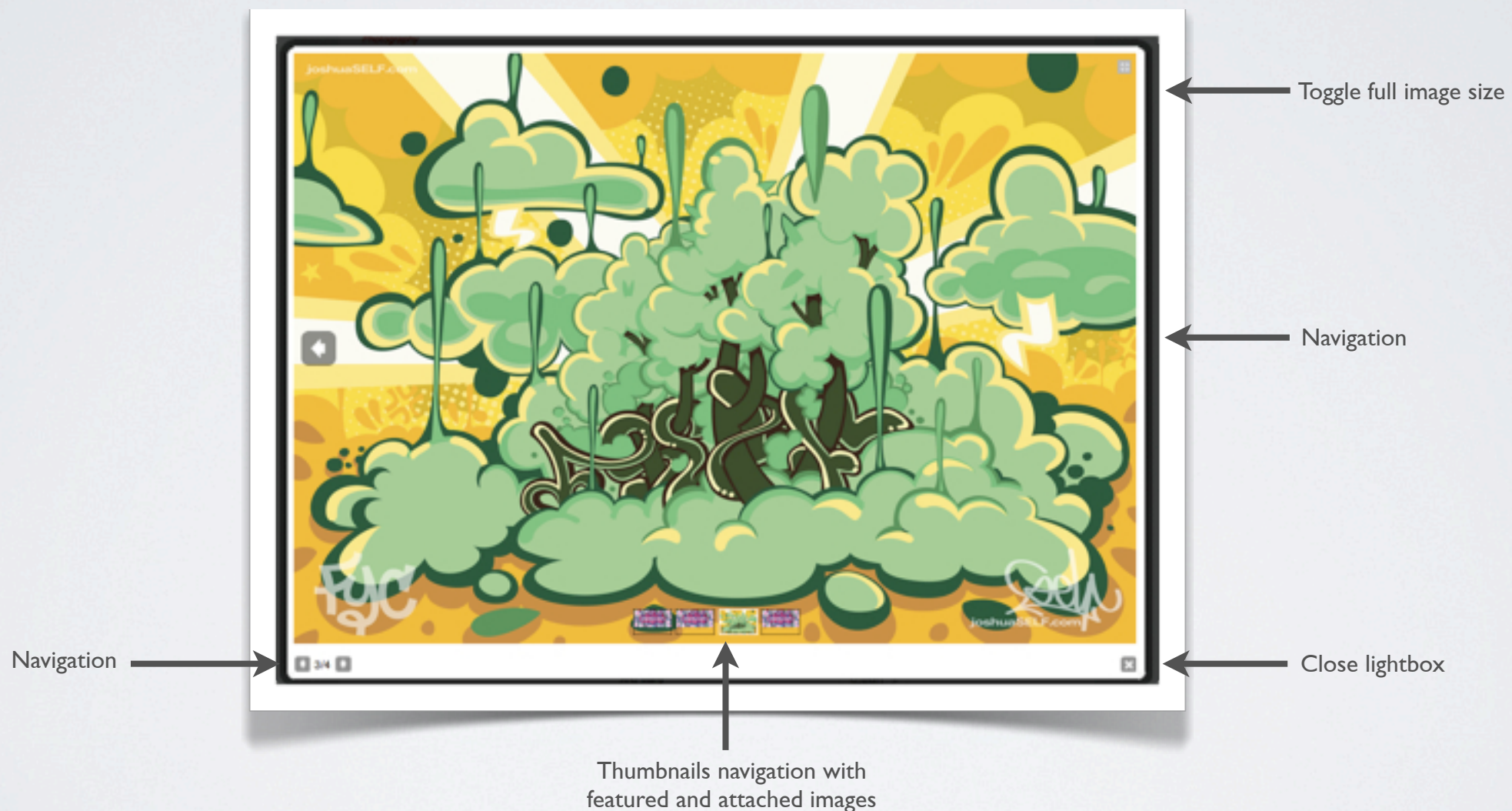
8. To add images additional to a portfolio item, locate each image on the **Media Library > Library** page and click **Attach**. In the popup box, enter the name of the portfolio page, select **My Portfolio** and click **Search**. Then, select the portfolio item's page and click **Select**. These items will appear in the portfolio item's lightbox.

My Portfolio

The lightbox allows users to view a portfolio item's featured and attached images using thumbnails and scroll buttons. This lightbox appears when the user clicks a featured image on portfolio listing pages and portfolio item pages. Portfolio items with a custom video will display the video but not featured or attached images in the lightbox.

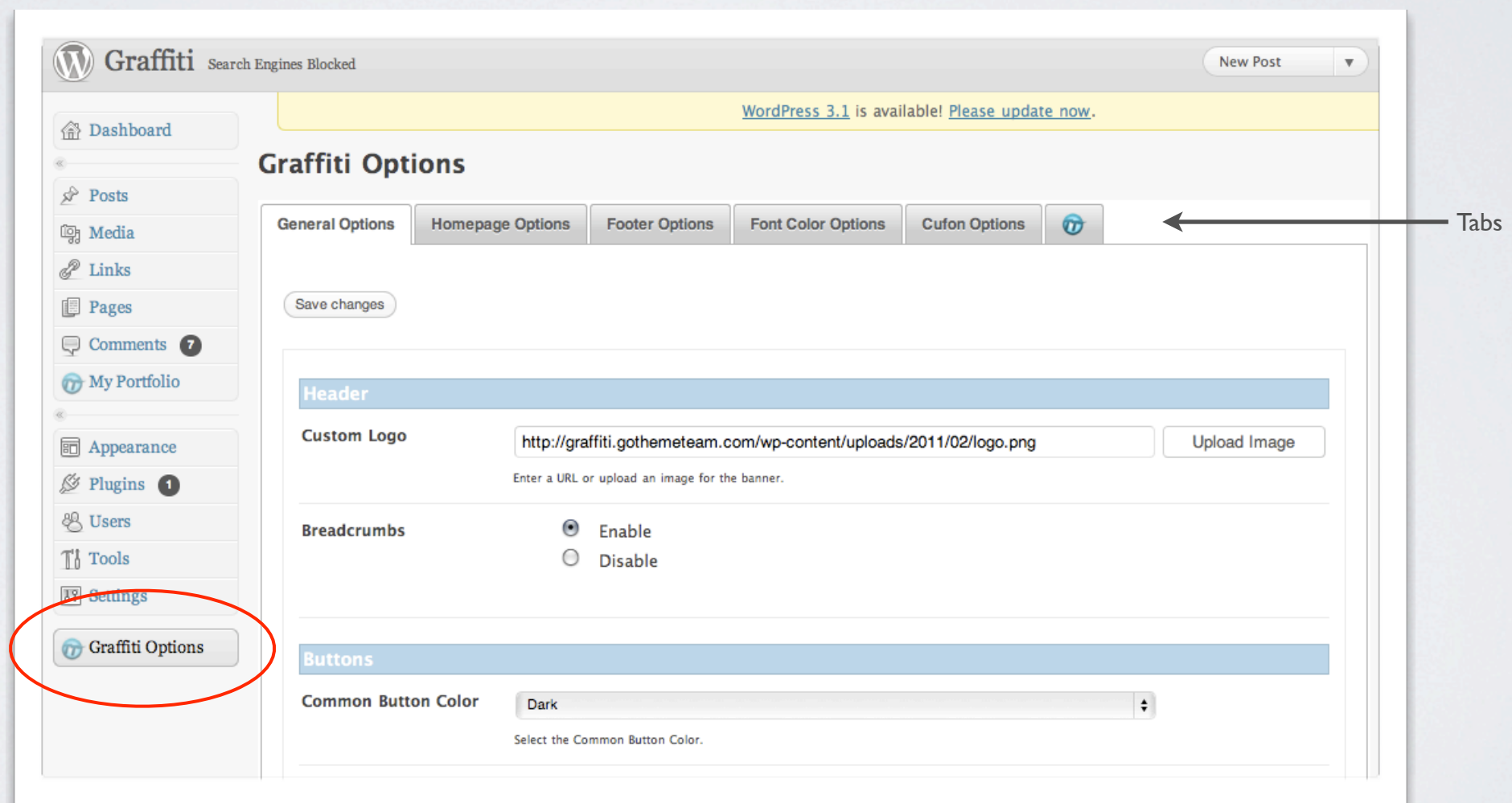


Custom Theme Options

Overview

When Graffiti is activated in WordPress, a custom admin panel called **Graffiti Options** appears in the Dashboard. The panel contains custom theme options organized under these tabs: General Options, Homepage Options, Footer Options, Font Color Options, Cufon Options, and Theme Team (indicated by a logo).

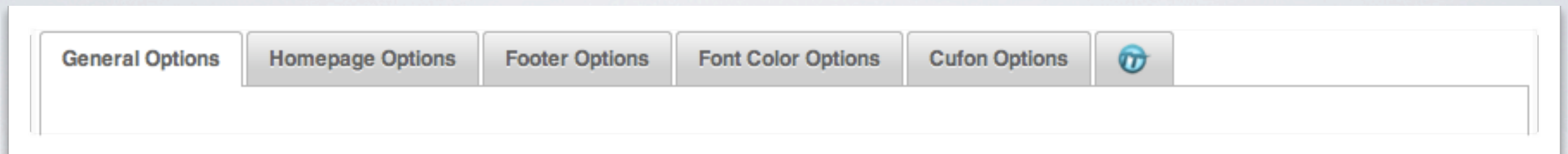
Click the **Save Changes** button after making any changes in the **Graffiti Options** panel.


The **General Options** tab controls the custom logo, breadcrumbs, common button color, footer color, Google Analytics and Contact Us page contact email.

The **Header** pertains to elements at or near the top of the page.





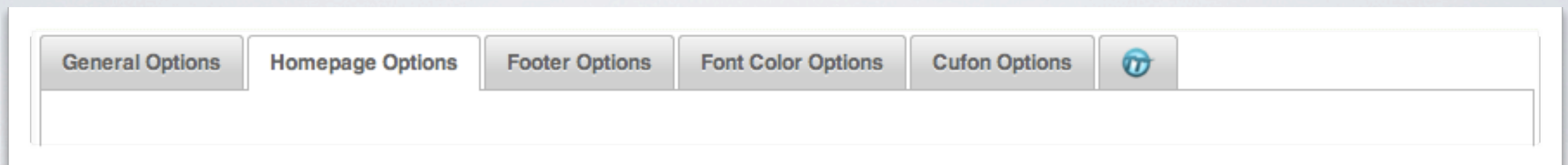

Featured Page IDs

Enter a comma separated list of the page IDs to display in the slider.

Featured Pages: Pages to appear in the slider. Select pages for the slider by clicking a page's button. When you click a page's button, that page's ID number will appear in the **Featured Page IDs** field. To deselect a page, click on its button again. The page's ID number will automatically remove itself from the **Featured Page IDs** field.


Featured Page IDs: The order in which pages appear in the slider. Set the order by arranging their ID numbers in this field.

To set a page's slider components (e.g. image, text), click **Save Changes** and navigate to that page's edit pane.

1. Under the main navigation menu, go to **Pages**. Select the slide's page from the list of published pages.
2. In the work area, you will see a box labeled **ThemeTeam Custom Page Options**. Each field in this box corresponds to a part of the slide:

Embed Video: The code for a video to appear in place of a slider image.

Video Width: The desired number of pixels for the embedded video's width in this field.

Video Height: The desired number of pixels for the video's height.


The page title will automatically appear as the slide's header.



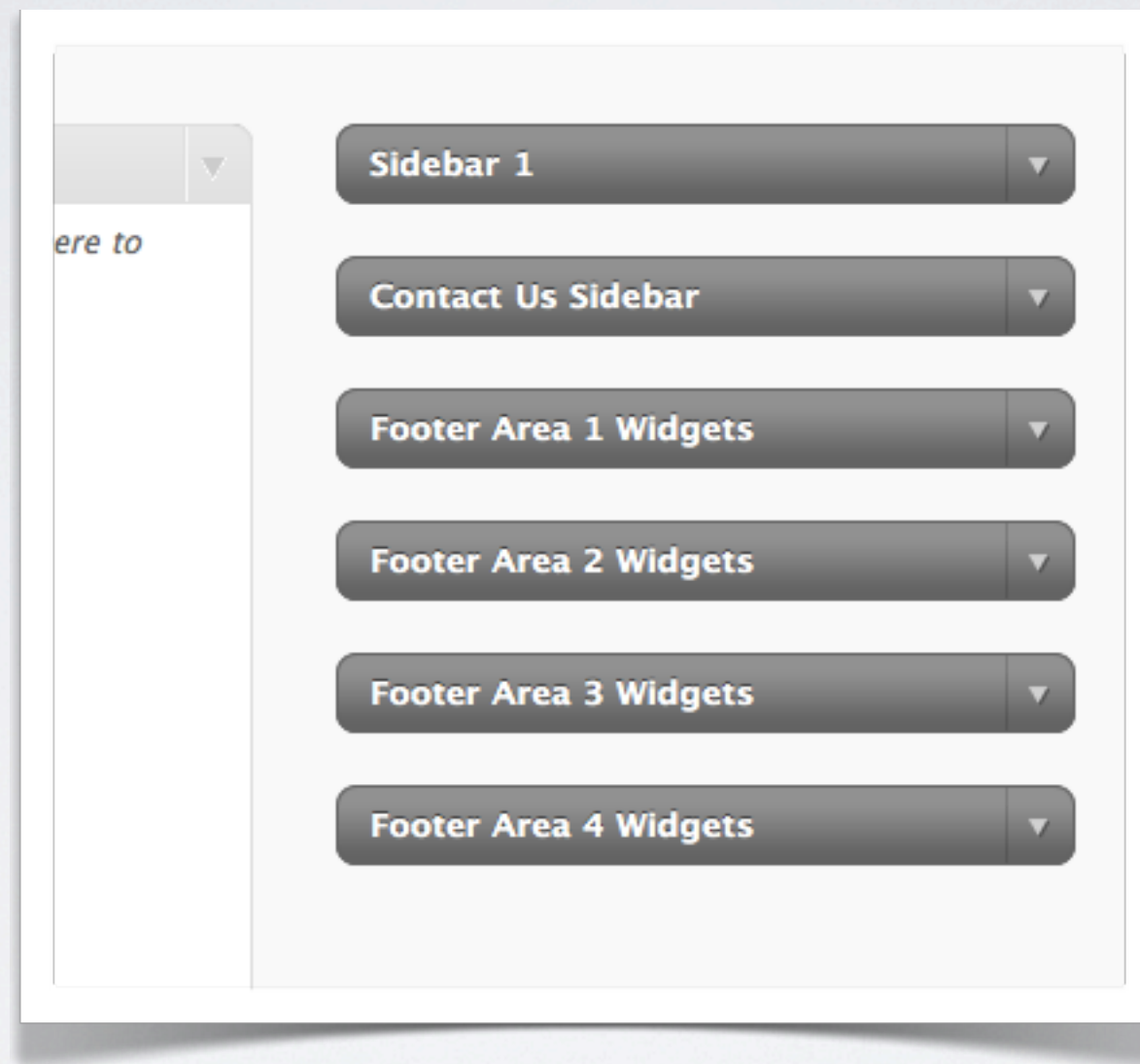

Banner Ads Widget

The Banner Ads widget can hold up to six banner ads in the sidebar. There are two fields for each ad in the widget's settings: one for its link and a second for the ad file's URL. If you leave any fields blank, there will simply be a blank space.

The Contact Info widget displays your contact information. This widget may be used in any sidebar, but is was created for the custom sidebar in the Contact Us page template. Add the widget to Contact Us pages by dragging it to the Contact Us sidebar.

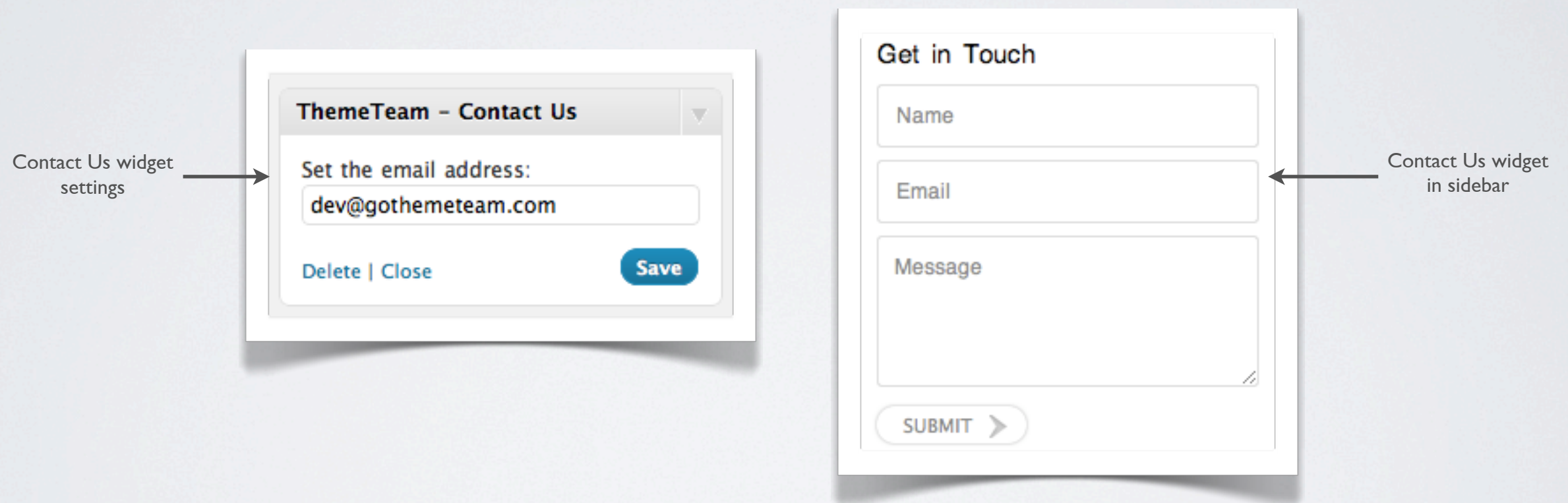

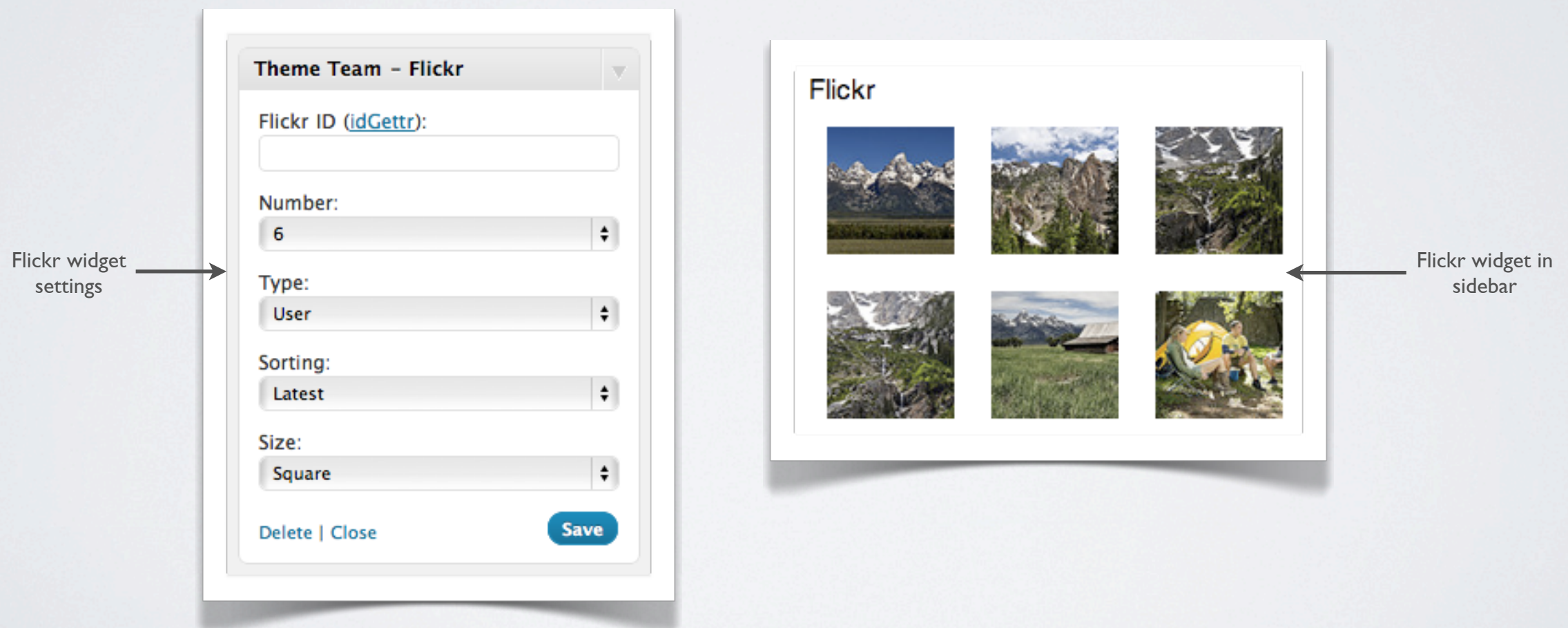

Flickr Widget

The Flickr widget displays up to 10 photos from your Flickr account. Enter your **Flickr ID** in the first field. Click the **idGettr** link for help finding your ID number. In the **Number** field, select the number of photos you want to display in the sidebar. Under **Type**, select **User** if you have an individual user account or **Group** if you have a group account. Under **Sorting**, select whether you want your latest Flickr photos displayed or if you want random photos displayed. Select the size in which you want your photos displayed in the **Size** drop-down menu.

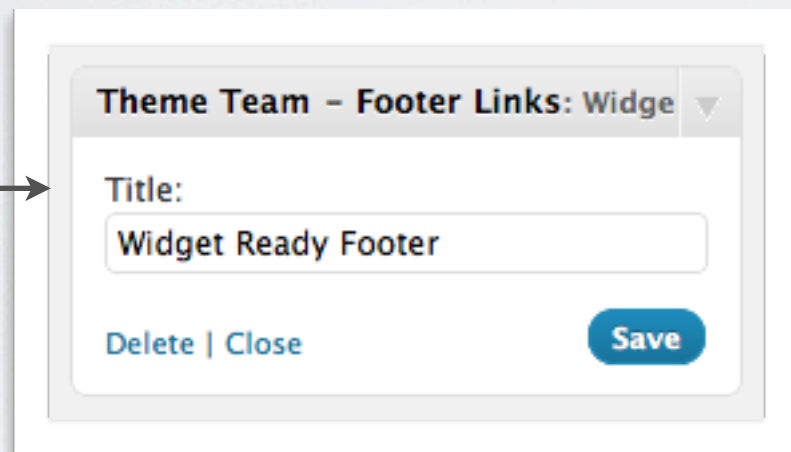

The Footer Links widget is basically a footer menu. It can be added to the regular sidebar, but was designed to be displayed as one of the footer area widgets. 

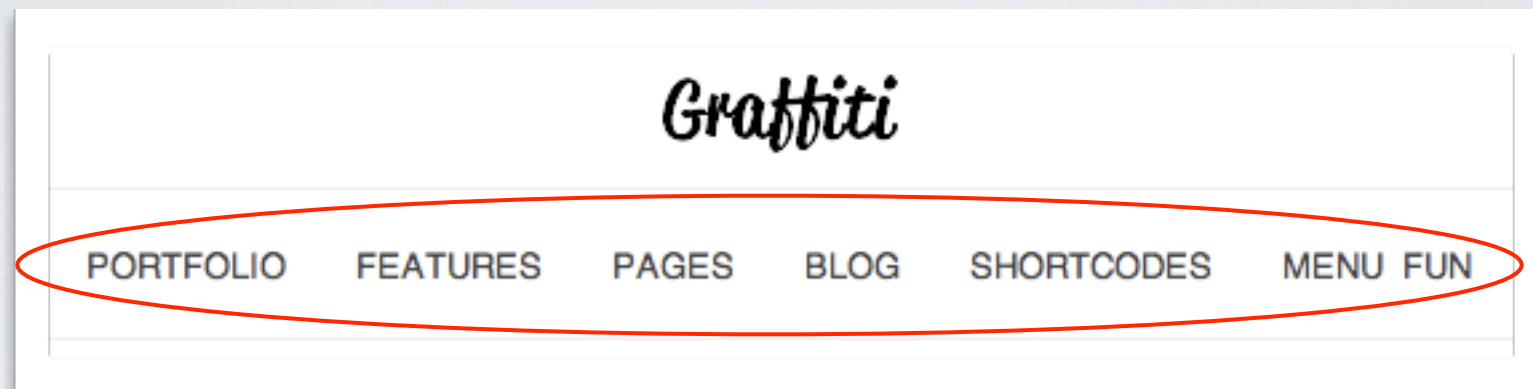

The second menu is called **Footer Links** and appears when the Footer Links widget is added to a sidebar.

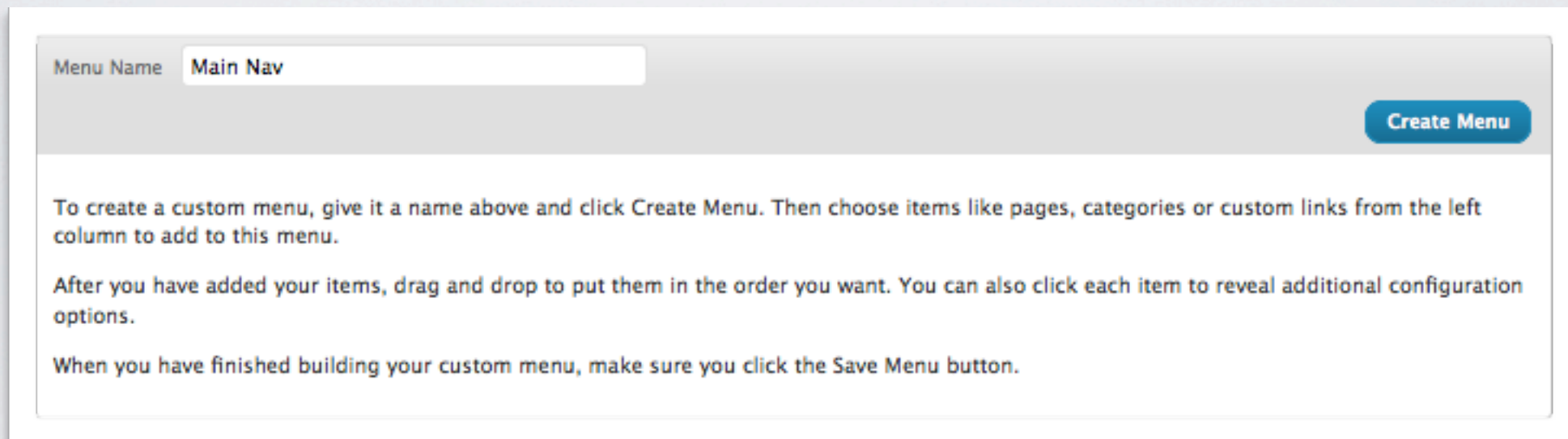

To create a menu:

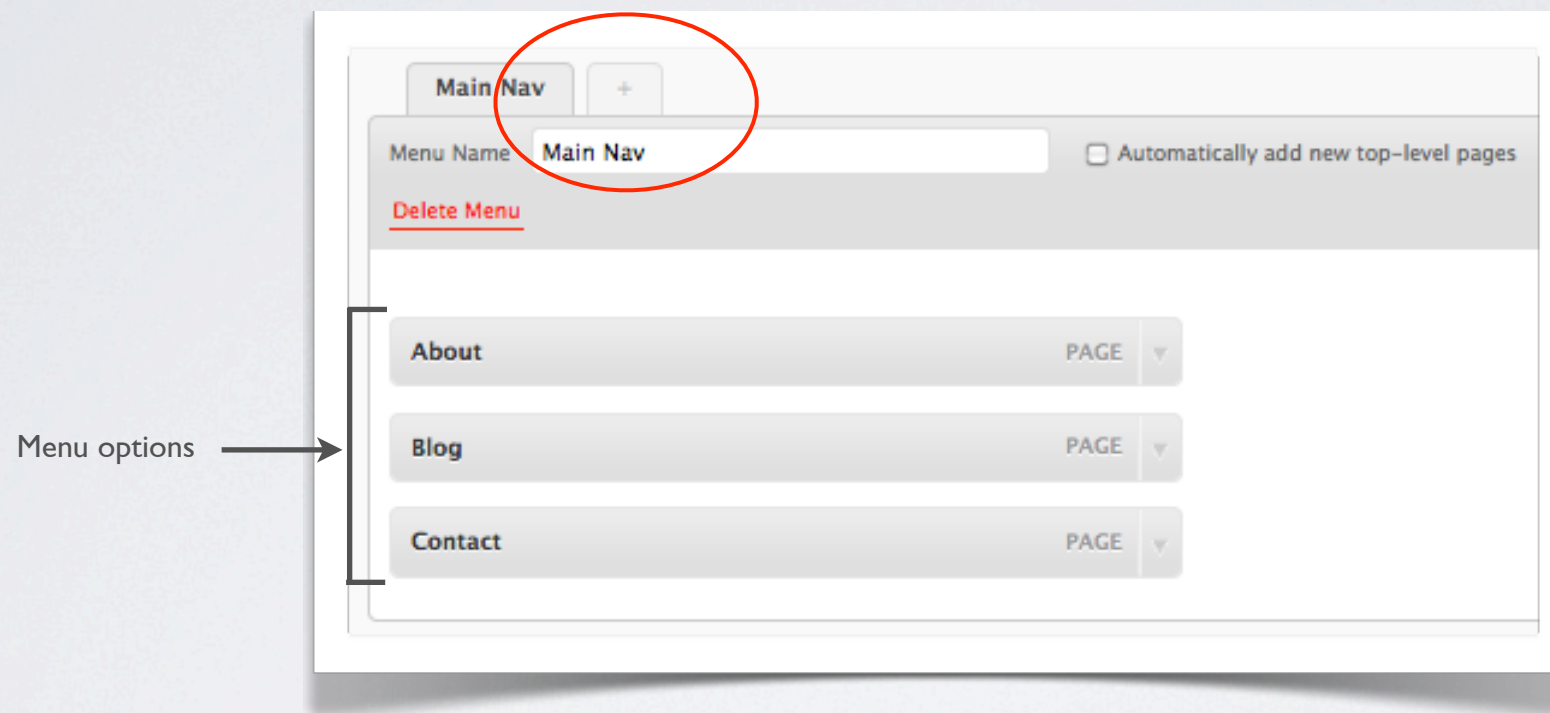
1. Under the navigation menu, go to **Appearance > Menus**.
2. On the right side of the work area is a menu tab. Enter a name for the menu in the **Menu Name** field and click the **Create Menu** button.

- Menu options are added to the menu's tab by selecting them in the **Pages** box on the left side of the work area. Select the page(s) and click the **Add to Menu** button. The page(s) will appear under the menu tab:

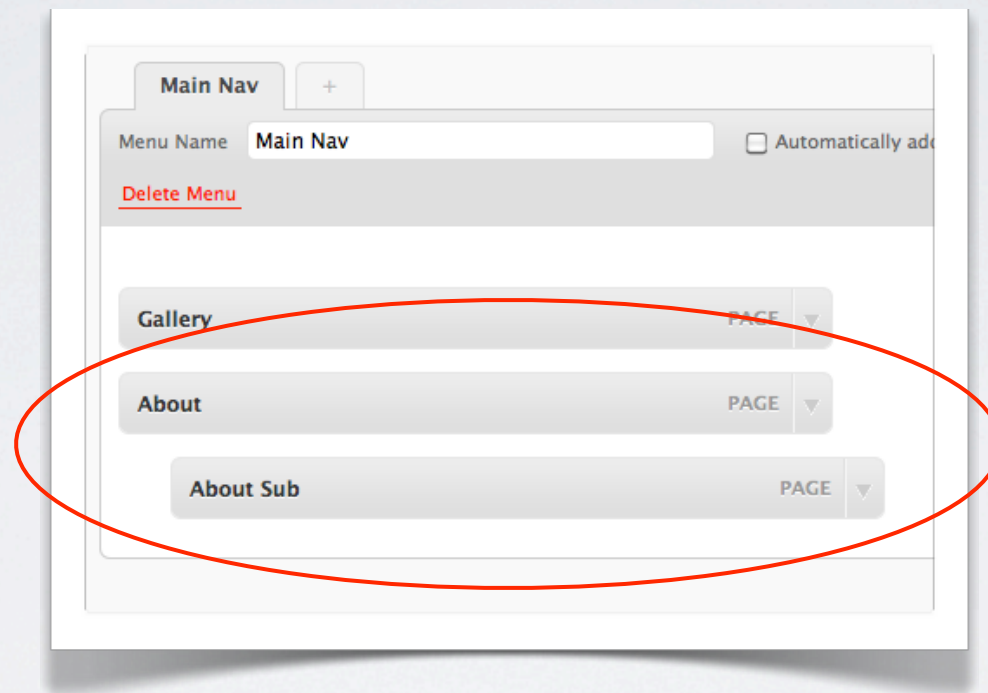


- Click the **Save Menu** button. To create another menu, click the plus sign to the right of the first menu's tab and repeat steps 2 and 3.

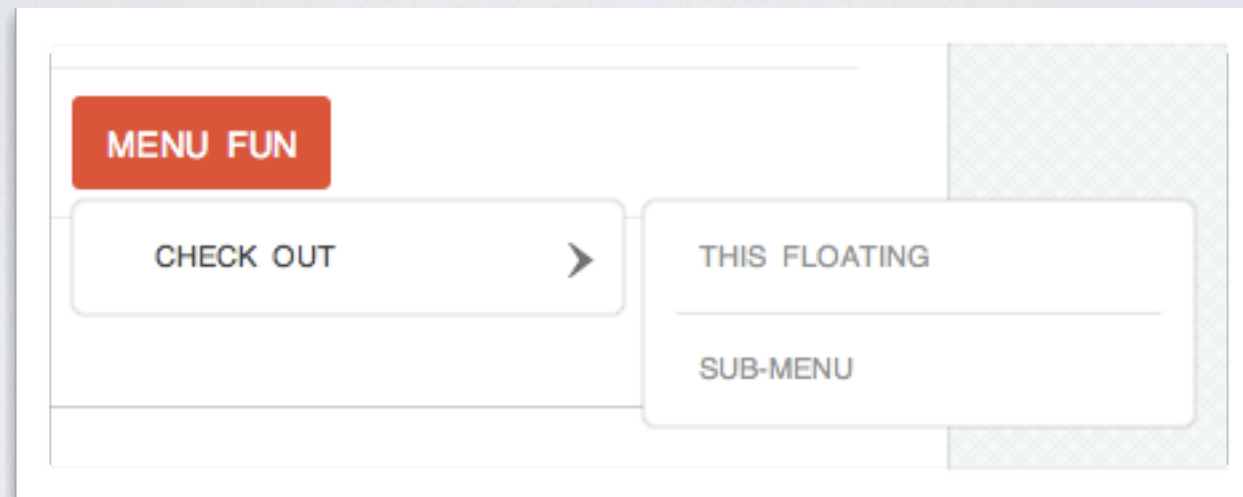

6. On the left side of the work area is a box called **Theme Locations**. Choose which menu will be the Main Nav menu and which menu will be the Widget Footer Links menu. Click the **Save** button.

Resizing Images

TimThumb PHP Script

Graffiti uses the TimThumb PHP script to resize images in the homepage slider.

If your images do not appear, open the image's URL in your web browser. If an error message appears instead of the image, make sure the **cache** folder in **/themes/Graffiti/functions/** is writeable. Then manually change the **cache** folder's permissions to 777.

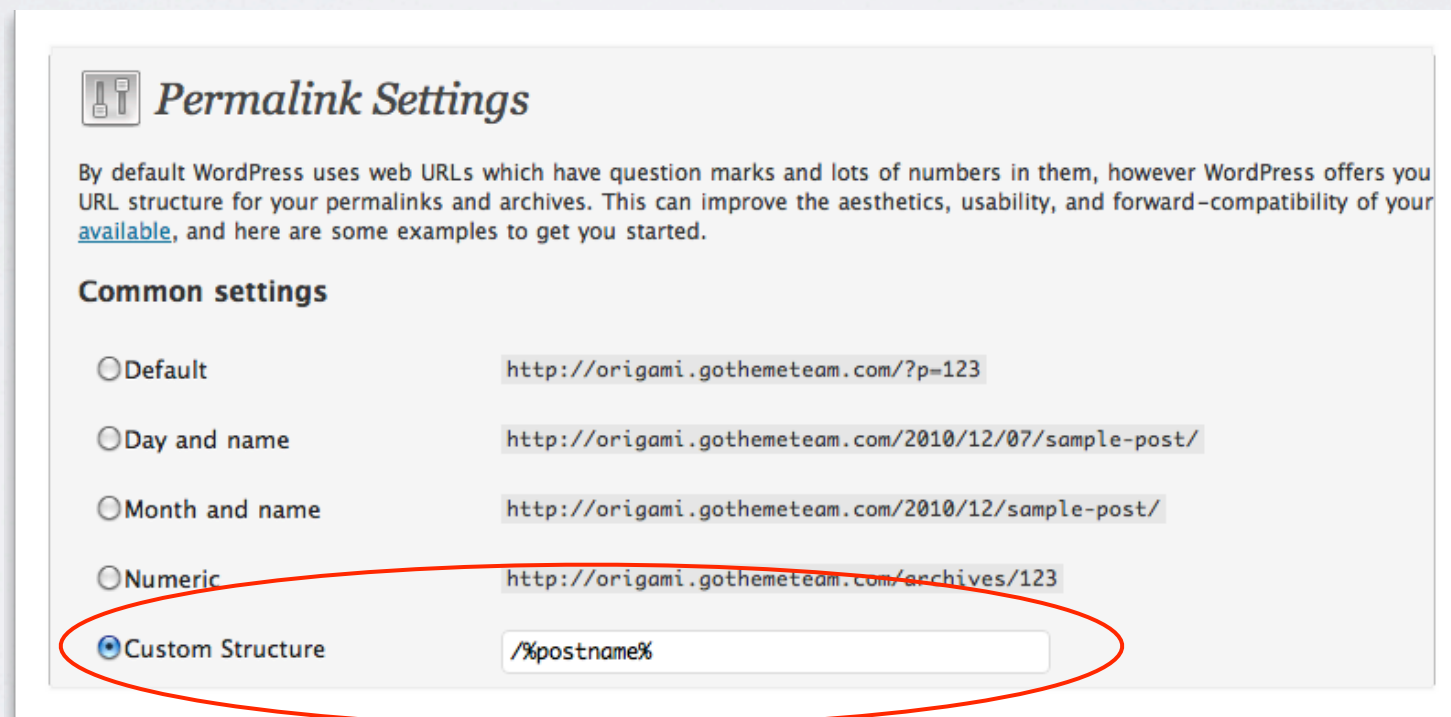
Permalink Structure

Recommended Settings

We highly recommend using the permalink custom structure `/%postname%/`, which will cover the Portfolio pages' pretty permalinks and reduce the chances of getting 404 Error messages on those pages.

To change the permalink settings:

1. In the main navigation menu, select **Settings > Permalinks**.
2. Under **Common Settings**, select **Custom Structure** and type `/%postname%/`.
